ALBERTA COURT OF JUSTICE

A General Warrant
Pursuant to Section 487.01 of the *Criminal Code*;

A Tracking Device Warrant
Pursuant to Section 492.1(1) of the *Criminal Code*;

An Assistance Order
Pursuant to Section 487.02 of the *Criminal Code*.

To the Peace Officers in the Province of Alberta:

1. Upon reading the Information on Oath of Constable Kevin Scott, a Peace Officer and member of the Calgary Police Service (CPS) in the City of Calgary, in the Province of Alberta to obtain the following:
 - a. A General Warrant pursuant to Section 487.01 of the Criminal Code;
 - b. A Tracking Device Warrant pursuant to Section 492.1(1) of the Criminal Code;
 - c. An Assistance Order pursuant to Section 487.02 of the Criminal Code.
2. And being satisfied that there are reasonable grounds to believe that the following offences have been or will be committed:
 - a. Importation of a Controlled Substance included in Schedule III to wit: Dimethyltryptamine, contrary to Section 6(1) of the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act (CDSA).

A General Warrant
Pursuant to Section 487.01 of the *Criminal Code*;

3. And Upon being satisfied that it is in the best interests of the administration of justice to issue the General Warrant and that there is no other provision in this or any other

Act of Parliament that would provide for a warrant, authorization or order permitting the techniques to be used.

4. And Upon being satisfied that the information concerning the named offence will be obtained through the use of the following investigative technique or procedure, it is Ordered that:
5. Any member of the Calgary Police Service, or any other person assisting a member of the Calgary Police Service or any other police officer, may complete the following technique or procedure, to wit:
 - a. Replace the suspected seized Dimethyltryptamine (DMT) from the Dalsey Hillblom and Lynn (DHL) courier package with tracking number 6284900882 shipped from Peru, addressed to Chad Gilles of [REDACTED], Alberta (The Package) with an inert substance of the same weight as the seized DMT;
 - b. Install a covert electronic device inside The Package that will remotely notify investigators when The Package is opened;
 - c. Conduct a controlled delivery of The Package to the address [REDACTED];
 - d. Upon notification that The Package has been opened, or within a period of 12 hours of The Package being delivered, CPS will overtly enter into the following locations to search for evidence of the named offence:
 - i. [REDACTED] including detached garage and outbuildings;
 - ii. Any vehicle that The Package is transported in providing grounds exist that evidence of the named offence will be located within;
 - iii. Any residence or building that The Package is located when it is opened;
 - e. Upon entry being made into any of the locations referred to in sub paragraph d above, CPS will conduct a search for and seize the following things that will afford evidence of the named offence:
 - i. Drugs as defined by the CDSA;

- ii. Documentation relating to the ordering and importation of the DMT including but not limited to credit card statements, online communications relating to the ordering and internet history related to the accessing and importation from Peru;
 - iii. Computers, cell phones, tablets, digital storage devices, or other internet capable devices which can hold evidence of the purchase, importation or communication of The Package;
 - iv. Documentation pertaining to passwords or means of accessing the seized items;
 - v. Any other data that will afford evidence of the named offences as well as demonstrate knowledge, possession or control of The Package.
6. It is further ordered that this General Warrant be subject to the following terms and conditions:
- a. The authorization will be valid for five days from the morning of February 8, 2024;
 - b. The Package will utilize the original DHL packing slip and packaging that was seized by CBP. The Package will then appear in a consistent manner of how it was originally shipped;
 - c. DHL will change the tracking system to reflect the Package as "in transit" prior to the item being delivered and "item out for delivery" on the day the delivery is to be conducted. Along with the ability to add the term "item on hold at postal facility to verify address of recipient" to provide an explanation for any delays;
 - d. An undercover officer will deliver the DHL Package. The undercover officer will be posing as a DHL employee and DHL will provide a DHL uniform, DHL vehicle, DHL storefront location, DHL signature documents, and other related equipment as required in the performance of their duties;
 - e. The undercover officer, posing as a DHL employee will deliver the Package to [redacted] and request that any person that accepts the Package provide picture identification and a personal signature;
 - f. Once the Package has been delivered police will keep continuity of the Package with the tracking device at [redacted];
 - g. The DHL Package will have a covert electronic device installed prior to the controlled delivery by an undercover officer that will remotely notify investigators when the DHL Package has been opened;

- h. The authorization will allow for a maximum of five attempts for a controlled delivery to take place;
- i. Once the covert device notifies CPS that the package has been opened, or at any time within 12 hours of the package being delivered, CPS are authorized for a single entry to enter and overtly search the following locations:
- i. [REDACTED] Calgary, Alberta including detached garage and outbuildings;
 - ii. Any vehicle that The Package is transported in providing grounds exist that evidence of the named offence will be located within;
 - iii. Any residence or building that The Package is located when it is opened;
- j. The search authorizes CPS to search for the following things:
- i. Drugs as defined by the CDSA;
 - ii. Documentation relating to the ordering and importation of the DMT including but not limited to credit card statements, online communications relating to the ordering and internet history related to the accessing and importation from Peru;
 - iii. Computers, cell phones, tablets, digital storage devices, or other internet capable devices which can hold evidence of the purchase, importation or communication of The Package;
 - iv. Documentation pertaining to passwords or means of accessing the seized items;
 - v. Any other data that will afford evidence of the named offences as well as demonstrate knowledge, possession or control of The Package.
- k. Upon execution of the General Warrant a copy of the warrant will be provided to the occupant of any residence or vehicle who occupy the location searched;
- l. During any search of The Residence, or vehicle and other locations, CBSA Officer(s) are authorised to attend as subject matter experts to assist in the identification and relevancy as it may relate to illegally imported and exported goods;
- m. No person to whom the General Warrant has been disclosed shall divulge the existence of the General Warrant to any other person, except those persons

who may be required to carry out its terms or in furtherance of the Administration of Justice.

**A Tracking Device Warrant
Pursuant to Section 492.1(1) of the *Criminal Code*.**

7. AND Upon being Satisfied that the requirements of Section 492.1(1) of the Criminal Code have been met and that tracking The Package movement by identifying the location will assist in the investigation of the offence.
8. This is therefore to authorize a Tracking Device Warrant be issued pursuant to Section 492.1(1) of the Criminal Code to authorize any member of the CPS, any other peace officer, or any other person acting under the direction thereof, for a time period of 60 days, from and including the day on which the warrant is issued, to obtain tracking data to track the location or movement of a Package through the use of a tracking device and to install, activate, use, maintain, monitor and remove a tracking device, including covertly, on:
 - a. The Package addressed to Chad Gilles and address c [REDACTED] Calgary, Alberta with tracking number 6284900882 on it.
9. It is ordered that the Tracking Device Warrant be subject to the following terms and conditions:
 - a. Any member of CPS and/or any other person acting under the direction thereof, may enter onto private property within Canada anytime day or night to install, activate, maintain and/or remove the tracking device;
 - b. During the installation, maintenance and/or removal of the tracking device, no person is authorized under the Tracking Device Warrant to conduct a search for evidence or information.


**An Assistance Order
Pursuant to Section 487.02 of the *Criminal Code*.**



10. It is further ordered that any person including DHL provide such assistance as is reasonably required to give effect to the related Warrants and Orders. Without restricting the generality of the foregoing, such assistance shall include:

- a. Provide a DHL uniform for the undercover police operator and other related equipment or vehicles, to allow the police to deliver the package to the intended recipient;
- b. Provide DHL identifiers, and items delivered bill records to reflect the regular course of delivery;
- c. Update and change the DHL tracking system for the package as directed by a peace officer with CPS.
- d. No person providing assistance, including their employees, servants and agents, may directly or indirectly disclose or permit disclosure of any assistance provided, or the content existence or operation of this Warrant and Order to any person except as may be necessary for the purposes of compliance with the assistance order, or obtaining the advice or assistance of legal counsel, unless otherwise ordered by a Court of competent jurisdiction.
